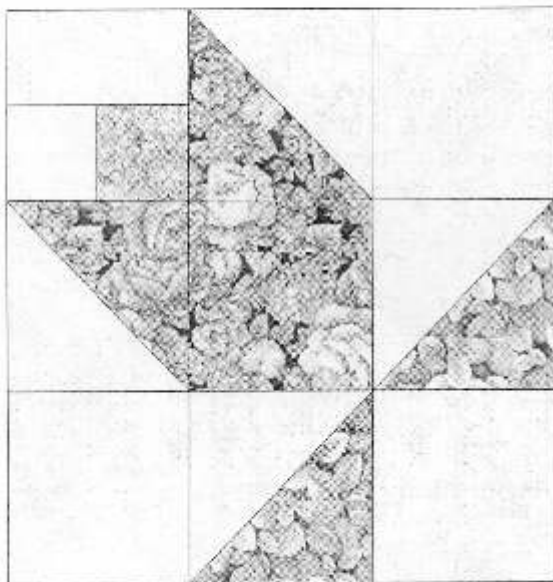

Block of the Month

SPRING HAS SPRUNG



It's time for spring flowers to appear. This easy tulip block can be used in a variety of layouts to make an attractive spring quilt.

Finished block is 9x9.

Let's give it a Victorian appeal using lots of rose, mauve or burgundy prints for the flower. Use mossy or sage green prints for the leaves and a gold or yellow for flower center. Background should be beige to light tans.

Increase your odds. Make lots!

Cut pieces as follows:

Squares $3\frac{1}{2} \times 3\frac{1}{2}$

Cut 3 of background fabric
Cut one of floral flower fabric

Squares 2×2

Cut one of background fabric
Cut one of gold or yellow for flower center

Rectangle $3\frac{1}{2} \times 2$

Cut one of background fabric

For Half Square Triangles Cut $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Squares

Cut two squares (4 triangles) of background
Cut one square (2 triangles) of flower fabric
Cut one square (2 triangles) of leaf fabric

Sewing Directions:

Sew small background square to the gold square using $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Press toward gold. Sew these to the rectangle so gold square is in lower right. Press toward rectangle. Sew the floral triangles to background triangles to form a square. Sew leaf triangles to background triangles to form squares. Sew three squares in a row per drawing. Sew three rows together to complete block.

Next step – make lots more!
