Cards of gratitude that read “this quilt is his world” from a Children’s Advocacy Center client and “bright, beautiful quilts make the process a little better” from a Rape Crisis Center client inspire the **Quilters Guild of Plano** to make hundreds of quilts, fleece blankets, baby bonnets, stockings, and other knitted items for community outreach organizations. The guild accumulated 4,000 community service hours last year making over 400 items for the Collin County Children’s Advocacy Center, the Rape Crisis Center of Collin County, Medical Center of Plano’s neonatal unit, Newborns In Need, The Fisher House, Project Linus, and Operation Quilted Comfort.

The 10th biennial **Quilt Plano** show is August 14–15 at the Plano Centre. About 300 quilts will be on display and over 35 vendors will be selling and demonstrating quilt-related products, sewing machines, and longarm quilting machines. The Plano Sewing Center will provide sewing machines for public use so that anyone can learn how to make quilt blocks. On Saturday, there will be a raffle drawing for the “Indigo Friendship Star” quilt, and raffle tickets are \$1 each.

Karen Christoffer, service quilt chair for the guild, said of the show, “Not only can you see some beautiful masterpieces but it’s the first time we’ll feature a youth ‘Sit & Sew.’ The kids can learn how to make quilt blocks that our Community Service Group will make into quilts that will [then] be donated to our local charities.”

The quilt show is Friday, August 14 from 9 a.m.–6 p.m. and Saturday, August 15 from 9 a.m.–5 p.m. Admission is \$6 pre-sale, \$7 at the door; free for children 11 and under. Visit quiltersguildofplano.org.
